

2 Pre-cut felt shapes, 1 spool of embroidery thread, 2 spools of yarn, 2 plastic needles, stuffing and detailed instructions. (A pair of scissors is also needed but is not included. Adult supervision is required when using scissors.)


B. BACK STITCHES






Before you start stitching your pillow, first learn a basic stitch - Back Stitch. Back stitch is a strong stitch. It is mainly used for stitching 2 layers of fabric together or for outlining.


C. HOW TO THREAD YARN THROUGH A NEEDLE




- 1. Here is an easier way than threading the yarn tip through directly. Fold the yarn tightly around the eye of the needle. Once it is in place, pinch the yarn firmly around the needle with your left thumb and forefinger.
- 2. Pull the needle out of the yarn. Keep holding the yarn tightly with your left thumb and forefinger. You now have a crisply folded piece of yarn in one hand.
- 3. Push the folded end through the eye of the needle.
- 4. And there you have it. Your needle should now be threaded.

D. UNICORN YARN MANE








Cut 24 pieces of 15cm-long pink and orange yarn respectively. Thread one piece of each colour yarn through the needle using the technique in section C.

The mane area is indicated as orange in the border of the felt template. Align both the front and back pieces of felt. Pass the needle into and then out of the same hole to form a small loop. Remove the needle.


Pass all the 4 ends through the loop and pull tight. Repeat the same process all the way along to achieve a nice full mane.

E. MAKING THE UNICORN TAIL



Cut a 20cm length from the orange yarn. Unwind the two spools of yarns from the carton cardboard and then wrap them onto one of the cardboard pieces as shown. Tie the 20cm orange yarn around one side of the loop to hold the strands in place. Turn it over and cut the other side of the loop. Leave it for section F.

F. SEWING THE UNICORN PILLOW



Use the peach thread and the back stitch technique to sew the front and back felt shapes together. You may start sewing under the mane area.

Place the tail in between the two felts, at the bottom right area of the unicorn, where indicated in dark pink colour.

Continue stitching to secure the tail, leaving a part of the body unstitched. Tuck in the stuffing and finish the hemming. Gorgeous! Your unicorn pillow is finished!

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
